Bible reading: Nehemiah 1:1 - 2:10

1 The words of Nehemiah son of Hacaliah:

In the month of Kislev in the twentieth year, while I was in the citadel of Susa, ² Hanani, one of my brothers, came from Judah with some other men, and I questioned them about the Jewish remnant that survived the exile, and also about Jerusalem.

- 3 They said to me, "Those who survived the exile and are back in the province are in great trouble and disgrace. The wall of Jerusalem is broken down, and its gates have been burned with fire."
- 4 When I heard these things, I sat down and wept. For some days I mourned and fasted and prayed before the God of heaven. 5 Then I said:
- "O LORD, God of heaven, the great and awesome God, who keeps his covenant of love with those who love him and obey his commands. 6 let your ear be attentive and your

eyes open to hear the prayer your servant is praying before you day and night for your servants, the people of Israel. I confess the sins we Israelites, including myself and my father's house, have committed against you. I We have acted very wickedly toward you. We have not obeyed the commands, decrees and laws you gave your servant Moses.

- ⁹ "Remember the instruction you gave your servant Moses, saying, 'If you are unfaithful, I will scatter you among the nations, ⁹ but if you return to me and obey my commands, then even if your exiled people are at the farthest horizon, I will gather them from there and bring them to the place I have chosen as a dwelling for my Name.'
- "They are your servants and your people, whom you redeemed by your great strength and your mighty hand. 11 O Lord, let your ear be attentive to the prayer of this your servant and to the prayer of your servants who delight in revering your name. Give your servant success today by granting him favour in the presence of this man."

I was cupbearer to the king.

- In the month of Nisan in the twentieth year of King Artaxerxes, when wine was brought for him, I took the wine and gave it to the king. I had not been sad in his presence before; 2 so the king asked me, "Why does your face look so sad when you are not ill? This can be nothing but sadness of heart."
- I was very much afraid, ³ but I said to the king, "May the king live forever! Why should my face not look sad when the city where my fathers are buried lies in ruins, and its gates have been destroyed by fire?"
- 4 The king said to me, "What is it you want?" Then I prayed to the God of heaven, 5 and I answered the king, "If it pleases the king and if your servant has found favour in his sight, let him send me to the city in Judah where my fathers are buried so that I can rebuild it."
- ⁶ Then the king, with the queen sitting beside him, asked me, "How long will your journey take, and when will you get back?" It pleased the king to send me; so I set a time.
- I also said to him, "If it pleases the king, may I have letters to the governors of Trans-

Euphrates, so that they will provide me safeconduct until I arrive in Judah? § And may I have a letter to Asaph, keeper of the king's forest, so he will give me timber to make beams for the gates of the citadel by the temple and for the city wall and for the residence I will occupy?" And because the gracious hand of my God was upon me, the king granted my requests. § So I went to the governors of Trans-Euphrates and gave them the king's letters. The king had also sent army officers and cavalry with me.

When Sanballat the Horonite and Tobiah the Ammonite official heard about this, they were very much disturbed that someone had come to promote the welfare of the Israelites.

Nehemiah 1:1 - 2:10: Praying out of concern for the Lord's people who bear His Name

Susa = the capital of Persia; King Artaxerxes = the King of Persia; Kislev = December

- 586BC: Babylonians destroy Jerusalem and Temple. Majority of God's Old Testament people into exile.
- 539BC: Babylonian empire falls to King Cyrus of Persia, who allows exiles to return to rebuild temple.
- 536-516BC: Opposition but altar and foundations built. Recorded in Ezra 1-6. Haggai & Zechariah prophesy to get the temple built.
- 515BC: Temple rebuilt but smaller than Solomon's and not the glorious temple prophesied in Ezekiel.
- 458BC: Ezra returns with second group of exiles. Ezra 7-10
- 445BC: Nehemiah returns with third group of exiles and start to rebuild the city walls.

The city and temple represent the Lord dwelling with His people knowing His blessing.

The Lord made great promises (prophecies) about his people coming back from exile, a new covenant, a renewed city, a glorious new temple with the nations being gathered in to know His blessing.

Will the Lord's people be renewed in humble obedience to His Word? The work starts with a praying servant...

- 1. Pray out of concern for the Lord's people who bear His Name (v1-4)
- 'A dwelling for my Name' v9
- 2. Pray knowing the Lord's promises to His people (v5)
- 3. Pray confessing the disobedience of the Lord's people to His Word (v6-7)
- 4. Pray for the saving and gathering of the Lord's people who repent (v8-10)
- 5. Pray patiently, ready to serve and speak for the Lord (1v11 2v10)
