Church Council & Church Warden nominations

Church Council

Do you know somebody in the church family who might serve on the Trinity Church Council? There are 2 places to fill from the Annual Church Meeting on Wednesday 15th June. Under the Constitution the Church Council has responsibility for the finances, fabric, our Mission Partners, day to day admin and running of the church and most importantly the practical care and support of church members. Within the Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) that is Trinity Church, Council members act as trustees of the church.

We ask that those proposed are church members, that they wholeheartedly believe Trinity's doctrinal basis of faith as an Anglican Evangelical church, that they are servant hearted and committed to pray. The usual length of service is five years.

The Council usually meets 8 times a year on Monday nights. **Nominations with a proposer and seconder should be given to David Barnsley or the Wardens, Graham Todd and Nigel Reid by Sunday 29th May.** Their names with proposer and seconder will then be published on the service sheet on Sundays 5th and 12th June.

Church Warden

We thank God for Nigel Reid's great service as churchwarden over the last five years and for the enormous amount he has done in many areas. We are grateful that he will continue to serve the church by continuing to oversee the Tower project. We are looking for someone to replace him as church warden. Clearly this person will bring different gifts. Below are the qualifications and responsibilities of church wardens as outlined in the church constitution. **Any nomination for warden must be proposed and seconded by church members and be communicated to Dave or Graham by Sunday 29th May.** Their proposal needs to be made known on the service sheet for two Sundays prior to the AGM on Wednesday 15th June.

Qualifications of Churchwardens

In character the men and women appointed as Churchwardens must be servants at heart, wanting to serve and build up the body of Christ and enabling the pastoral leaders of the Church to fulfil their responsibilities. They must be mature Church Fellowship Members and committed to pray for the Church, its life and ministry. At the annual general meeting of the Church Fellowship Members the Churchwardens who are elected are to sign the following declaration:

"I _____ desiring to hold the office of Churchwarden in Trinity Church, Buxton do hereby declare:

- a) I consider myself to be a believing Christian trusting Jesus Christ as my Lord and Saviour.
- b) I accept and will abide by the constitution of the Church.
- c) I wholeheartedly believe the Doctrinal Basis of the Church."

and if anyone appointed as a Churchwarden refuse or fails to sign such a declaration within 28 days of their appointment then their appointment will automatically cease.

Duties of the Churchwardens

The first duty of a Churchwarden is to support the leadership of the Church in all matters relating to the spiritual and pastoral welfare of the Church in its life and ministry. Churchwardens shall also jointly oversee the implementation of any instructions of the Church Council and the smooth running of any committees of the Church Council.

Please note: Both of the above roles require a DBS application and Safeguarding Training.
